
Hollywood Book Festival Selects Audiobook Winner

RG Roane's The Delphinus Chronicles Takes Top Honors

HOLLYWOOD, California. The Hollywood Book Festival has selected RG Roane's page-turning novel *The Delphinus Chronicles* as the audiobook category winner for its 2006 awards honoring books that deserve greater recognition from the film, television, game and multimedia communities.

The Delphinus Chronicles—beautifully read by Helen Lisanti, with original music by Kennedy Smith—tells a remarkably original and entertaining story about the unintended consequences that develop when a computer with too much power is placed in proximity to an ocean-going species about which we know far too little. For a hint as to what species this might be, look to the night sky for the Constellation Delphinus, also known as "The Dolphin."

Synopsis

Students program their supercomputer to learn language, but the school is adjacent to an aquatic amusement park and the computer mistakenly learns to communicate with the world's dolphin population.
